Mission: Write the corresponding letter for each place on the list.  $Sydney\ Tower:$  It is Sydney's tallest structure and the second tallest observation tower in the Southern Hemisphere. It is 309m high. Sydney Harbour Bridge: Situated near the Opera House, the view of the bridge and the harbour (= un port) is very popular. It is possible to climb (= escalader) the bridge to admire the view over the bay. Sydney Royal Botanic Garden St Mary's Cathedral Australian Museum: It is the oldest museum in Australia with an international reputation in the fields of natural history and anthropology.  $\mathit{Sydney}$  (  $\mathit{pera}$   $\mathit{House}$  : It is the city's most iconic  $\mathit{landmark}$  (=  $\mathit{un}$   $\mathit{grand}$   $\mathit{monument}$ ) and one of the 20th century's most famous buildings. More than 8 million people visit it each year. Art Gallery of New South Wales Sydney State Theatre Queen Victoria Building: Constructed between 1893 and 1898, it is today one of the most beautiful shopping centre in the world. Mrs Macquarie's Chair: An exposed sandstone (= du grès) rock cut into the shape of a bench (= un banc). It was carved by convicts (= des prisonniers) in 1810 for Elizabeth Macquarie, the wife of the governor of New South Wales. Sydney Observatory Chinese Garden of Friendship Hyde Park: It is the oldest public parkland in Australia. The beautiful Archibald Fountain is located there. Australian National Maritime Museum Sydney Aquarium Martin Place: A pedestrian mall (= une zone piétonne) in the Central Business District. It is home to the Reserve Bank of Australia, the Commonwealth Bank and the General Post Office. The Domain: A 84 acre park. A temporary covered stage (= une scène) is erected every November for the summer festival season.  $Circular\ Quay:$  A harbour (=  $un\ port$ ) very popular for its walkways, malls, parks and

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restaurants.
