

## Let's visit American national parks!

Genially: Click on a letter. Look at the pictures and guess where you are. Mission: Write the corresponding letter for each place on the list. Mount Rushmore: A mountain in South Dakota. There are four faces of American presidents sculpted on its side. The sculptures are 18 meters tall. Sequoia National Park: This park preserves giant sequoia trees which are among the world's largest and oldest living things.  ${\it Crater Lake}: {\it A deep lake}$  with a deep blue color situated in Oregon. This volcanic crater was formed by the collapse of a volcano 7,500 years ago. Arches: These red sandstone arches are situated in Utah. There are more than 2,000 natural arches in the park. Great Sand Dunes: They are the tallest sand dunes in North America and the perfect place to practice sandboarding.  $\it Everglades:$  It is a tropical **river** and a **swamp** (=  $\it mar\'ecage$ ) where crocodiles and alligators live together. It is home of 40 bird species. Denali: It is the highest **mountain peak** in the USA. Many mammals live there such as grizzly and black bears, caribou and moose. There aren't any reptiles and only one amphibian can live there: the wood frog! White Sands Jean Lafitte Park: It is named after a French pirate. **Yosemite:** This site is famous for its imposing granite mountains, **waterfalls** and **glaciers**. Half-Dome is one of Yosemite's most famous sites and well-known in the climbing world (= le monde de l'escalade).  $Grand\ Canyon:$  Situated in Arizona, it is one of the most spectacular canyons in the world. It is a 446 kilometers long **gorge** cut by the Colorado River. *Yellowstone:* This park covers parts of three states: Wyoming, Montana and Idaho. It is home of the Old Faithful, a hot-water geyser. Voyageurs: A region of lakes in northern Minnesota, along the Canadian border. Visitors can spot gray wolves and do snowshoeing in winter. **Monument** (Valley: This valley of rocks is composed of a group of vast sandstone buttes. The valley lies in the territory of the American Indian Navajo tribe.  ${\it Mammoth\ Cave}$  : The longest  ${\it cave}$  in the world and explorers continue to discover
