Malcolm X argues that the African Americans are constantly trapped either by the American society or by the white people. He claims that he is not attacked because of his religion but because of the color of his skin. He denounces Martin Luther King's movement. According to him they are fools to believe that the white people will help them to be treated equally. He advocates for violence by making references to "ballot" or "bullet" throughout the speech. For him, the black people are victims and living in a massive jail. He also refers to lynching as a common practice where the only difference is the people who do it and their accents.
