

**LEWIS CARROLL**

He is an English writer. He was born on January 27, 1832 in Daresbury, a village in England. When he was a child, he was very shy and loved inventing games.

His real name was Charles Lutwidge Dodgson. He studied mathematics at Oxford University. He lived in Oxford while teaching mathematics. He wrote books on mathematics and logic.

Alice's Adventures in Wonderland was published in 1865. Another book about Alice, *Through the Looking-Glass*, appeared in 1871. Dodgson wrote the books under the name Lewis Carroll. His books were very popular. He also wrote books of poetry for children.

He died in Guildford, England, on January 14, 1898.
